Gospel Reflection ~ November 26, 2017

The Gospel parables from the past two Sundays focus on preparedness for Christ's coming again, with images of the coming of the bridegroom and return of the master. The virgins who were prepared enjoyed the marriage feast and the faithful servants received the master's generosity, while unprepared bridal attendants were shut out of the marriage feast and a fearful servant cast into darkness. Today's Gospel follows these two parables in Matthew's account, this time speaking of the coming of the Son of Man. The scene is the Last Judgment where we see people who prepared well for the coming of the Son of Man, and those who did not. The criterion for judgment comes as a surprise to the people in the narrative, as well as to audiences who hear it.

The judge is the Son of Man, coming in glory. He separates sheep and goats, an action easily understood by a first-century audience, with the more valuable sheep given a privileged position on the right. Like the wise virgins and the faithful servants, those placed on the right are well prepared for the coming of the Son of Man. They are blessed because of what is traditionally called "the works of mercy": feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, and so forth. While apparently the blessed ones performed these works for "the least brothers of mine," they in fact did it for the king. Those who did not perform any of the works of mercy are comparable to the unprepared virgins and the fearful servant, and receive a similar harsh punishment.

"The least ones" has been interpreted in a variety of ways. Because the Son of Man refers to them as "least brothers of mine," "least of these brothers and sisters of mine," some scholars see them as Jesus' own disciples, or more narrowly, as Christian missionaries. Thus, the way people treat Jesus' disciples is the basis for judgment. A broader interpretation regards the least ones as any disadvantaged members of society. All people will be judged on the mercy they show to the hungry, thirsty, naked, and so on, whether they are Jesus' disciples or not. Whatever the original intent of the judgment scene may have been, the broader, universalist understanding offers an important challenge to all of us who hear this Gospel. The little ones of our world all belong to Christ, and in showing mercy to them, we meet the Christ who will also come as judge.
